



Business Description

Braskem SA manufactures and sells chemicals, petrochemicals, fuels, and utilities. The company's geographical segments include Brazil; the United States and Europe and Mexico. It derives a majority of its revenue from Brazil. It produces olefins, such as ethylene, polymer and chemical-grade propylene, butadiene, and butene-1; fuels, such as automotive gasoline, liquefied petroleum gas, or LPG, ethyl tertiary-butyl ether, or ETBE, and methyl tertiary-butyl ether, or MTBE; intermediates, such as cumene and others.

Valuation as of 17 May 2024

Morningstar maintains a 3-star quantitative star rating for Braskem, derived from the firm's valuation and uncertainty scores.

The company's shares last closed at 3.50, below our quantitative fair value estimate of 5.31. These shares have traded between a 57.99% and 30.65% discount to their fair value estimate over the past year. In Morningstar's equity coverage universe for this methodology, the company's valuation rating lands at the 29th percentile; in the basic materials sector, the firm's score lies at the 51st percentile (meaning the shares are more undervalued than 51% of stocks in the sector).

Furthermore, Braskem maintains a quantitative valuation uncertainty rating of Extreme.

The company has held this star rating since the previous rating of 4, which was last assigned on 05/06/2024. The uncertainty rating for Braskem has remained Extreme since the previous rating of Very High, which was last assigned on 05/06/2024.

The key factors behind these ratings are the company's EV-MV ratio and earnings yield. The enterprise value-to-market value ratio is 3.75, and its maximum earnings yield is -16.37%. The EV-MV ratio falls above the 95th percentile in the basic ma-

terials sector while the earnings yield is at the 17th percentile. Over the past year, the company's EV-MV ratio has ranged between 4.05 and 2.62; its earnings yield has ranged between -16.37% and -40.28%.

Economic Moat ^Q as of 17 May 2024

With a Morningstar quantitative moat rating of None, the quantitative moat score for Braskem falls at the 75th percentile in the basic materials sector and at the 67th in the equity coverage universe. The company has maintained its None quantitative moat rating since after 05/01/2024, when it was downgraded from Narrow.

We also assign a Moderate quantitative financial health rating to Braskem. The company's raw score on this metric, termed Distance to Default, ranks at the 10th percentile overall and 9th in the basic materials sector. Furthermore, this financial health rating has stayed Moderate over the last year.

Supporting these ratings are the company's sales yield and annualized trailing 12-month volatility. The sales yield of 450.04%, ranks at the 93rd percentile in the covered equity universe and at the 95th percentile among its peers. Meanwhile, its annualized trailing 12-month volatility of 41.52%, falls at the 64th percentile in the universe and the 44th percentile in the basic materials sector.

Fundamentals as of 17 May 2024

Braskem maintains losses per share of -7.66. The company further earns a return on invested capital of -5.56%. These values are calculated over a trailing 12-month period.

Quantitative Equity Report Overview

The quantitative report on equities consists of data, statistics and quantitative equity ratings on equity securities. Morningstar, Inc.'s quantitative equity ratings are forward looking and are generated by a statistical model that is based on Morningstar Inc.'s analyst-driven equity ratings and quantitative statistics. Given the nature of the quantitative report and the quantitative ratings, there is no one analyst in which a given report is attributed to; however, Mr. Lee Davidson, Head of Quantitative Research for Morningstar, Inc., is responsible for overseeing the methodology that supports the quantitative equity ratings used in this report. As an employee of Morningstar, Inc., Mr. Davidson is guided by Morningstar, Inc.'s Code of Ethics and Personal Securities Trading Policy in carrying out his responsibilities.

Quantitative Equity Ratings

Morningstar's quantitative equity ratings consist of: (i) Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, (ii) Quantitative Star Rating, (iii) Quantitative Uncertainty, (iv) Quantitative Economic Moat, and (v) Quantitative Financial Health (collectively the "Quantitative Ratings).

The Quantitative Ratings are calculated daily and derived from the analyst-driven ratings of a company's peers as determined by statistical algorithms. Morningstar, Inc. ("Morningstar", "we", "our") calculates Quantitative Ratings for companies whether or not it already provides analyst ratings and qualitative coverage. In some cases, the Quantitative Ratings may differ from the analyst ratings because a company's analyst-driven ratings can significantly differ from other companies in its peer group.

- i. Quantitative Fair Value Estimate: Intended to represent Morningstar's estimate of the per share dollar amount that a company's equity is worth today. Morningstar calculates the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate using a statistical model derived from the Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies. Please go to http://global.morningstar.com/equitydisclosures for information about Fair Value Estimate Morningstar's equity analysts assign to companies.
- ii. **Quantitative Economic Moat:** Intended to describe the strength of a firm's competitive position. It is calculated using an algorithm designed to predict the Economic Moat rating a Morningstar analyst would assign to the stock. The rating is expressed as Narrow, Wide, or None.

Narrow – assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 70% but less than 99%.

Wide — assigned when the probability of a stock receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is greater than 99%.

None — assigned when the probability of an analyst receiving a "Wide Moat" rating by an analyst is less than 70%.

- iii. **Quantitative Star Rating:** Intended to be the summary rating based on the combination of our Quantitative Fair Value Estimate, current market price, Quantitative Uncertainty Rating, and momentum. The rating is expressed as One-Star, Two-Star, Three-Star, Four-Star, and Five-Star.

After the initial calculation for the star rating, there is a final filtering step based on the momentum of the company. We rank the companies based on their 12-1 month momentum, then restrict those below the 30th percentile to a maximum of 3 stars

iv. **Quantitative Uncertainty:** Intended to represent Morningstar's level of uncertainty about the accuracy of the Quantitative Fair Value Estimate. Generally, the lower the Quantitative Uncertainty, the narrower the potential range of outcomes for that particular company. The rating is expressed as Low, Medium, High, Very High, and Extreme.

Low – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 10%
Medium – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 15%
but greater than 10%

 $\overrightarrow{\text{High}}-\text{the}$ interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 35% but greater than 15%

Very High – the interquartile range for possible fair values is less than 80% but greater than 35%

Extreme – the interquartile range for possible fair values is greater than 80%

v. **Quantitative Financial Health:** Intended to reflect the probability that a firm will face financial distress in the near future. The calculation uses a predictive model designed to anticipate when a company may default on its financial obligations. The rating is expressed as Weak, Moderate, and Strong.

Weak — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health < 0.2

Moderate — assigned when Quantitative Financial Health is between 0.2

and 0.7

Strong – assigned when Quantitative Financial Health > 0.7

Other Definitions

- i. Last Close Price of the stock as of the close of the market of the last trading day before date of the report.
- Quantitative Valuation— Using the below terms, intended to denote the relationship between the security's Last Price and Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate for that security.

Undervalued – Last Price is below Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Farily Valued – Last Price is in line with Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate.

Overvalued – Last Price is above Morningstar's quantitative fair value estimate

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Sustainalytics analyzes over 1,300 data points to assess a company's exposure to and management of ESG risks. In other words, ESG Risk Ratings measures a company's unmanaged ESG Risks represented as a quantitative score. Unmanaged Risk is measured on an open-ended scale starting at zero (no risk) with lower scores representing less unmanaged risk and, for 95% of cases, the unmanaged ESG Risk score is below 50.

Based on their quantitative scores, companies are grouped into one of five Risk Categories (negligible, low, medium, high, severe). These risk categories are absolute, meaning that a 'high risk' assessment reflects a comparable degree



of unmanaged ESG risk across all subindustries covered.

The ESG Risk Rating Assessment is a visual representation of Sustainalytics ESG Risk Categories on a 1 to 5 scale.
